WHO MAY APPLY:

Must be a current on-board AGR in the State of LA within the grade(s) of E5 and E6.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is open to the grades of: E5 to E6. Individual selected will receive an AGR Tour with the Louisiana Army National Guard. In order to be considered for this position's applicants must meet minimum qualifications as outlined on this announcement.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING: All documents will be uploaded to FTSMCS no later than 2300 as one PDF in the order listed on the checklist. If any of the required documents are not reasonably available to you, a brief letter will be submitted citing the documents missing with a short explanation necessary to certify the soldier as eligible. **Failure to do so may result in a finding of ineligibility and may cause the applicant to lose consideration for this position by the hiring agency.**

1. AGR APPLICATION

MINIMUM APPOINTMENT REQUIREMENTS:

All enlisted jobs will be staffed in accordance with LAARNG AGR Enlisted Career Management Policy dated 1 December 2023.

1. Applicant must have or be able to obtain the 74D3R MOS within one year of hire. 2. Must have or be able to obtain the additional minimum training requirements within one year of hire: Civil Support Skills Course, 9 weeks (Resident). Incident Command Structure 100, 200, 700, 800 (Distance Learning). Advanced Diagnostics Techniques LV1, 1 week (Resident). Applied Radiological Response Techniques LV1, 3 days (Distance Learning). Chemical Biological Recognition, Equipment, Equipment, Detection and Sampling Course, 2 weeks (Resident). Improvised Explosive Device Awareness Course, 1 week (Resident). Joint CBRN Characterization, Exploitation, and Mitigation Course, 1 week (Resident). 3. Must establish residence within 75 miles of Gillis W. Long Center and be prepared for one-hour recall, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, unless in an approved leave status. 4. Must have normal color vision. 5. Must not have a shaving profile. 6. Must be able to meet all requirements and qualifications to perform duties as a Hazmat Technician IAW NFPA 472. 7. Must meet and maintain OSHA Physical standards and pass a Pulmonary Function Test. 8. Must participate in routine physical fitness training in accordance with unit SOP to remain capable of performing physically demanding tasks. Soldier will take the Army Fitness Test semi-annually. 9. Must be able to receive required immunizations, to include Smallpox and Anthrax vaccinations. 10. Must be able to pass a WMD-CST Performance Test. 11. Must have the ability to receive and maintain a Secret Security Clearance.

ADDITIONAL JOB INFORMATION:

- All exception to Policy request must be processed through Chain of Command and submitted with your AGR application to the AGR Branch regardless of concurrence.
- Promotion contingent on control grade availability.
- LAARNG promotion policies apply together with maximum grade limitations for the position as designated by NGB and appropriate MTOE/TDA.
- Acceptance to a position of higher grade, SM will incur a service obligation in accordance with AR 600-8-19 upon promotion.
- Acceptance of tour is subject to personal interview, ACFT, and Army body fat standards upon notification of time and place. Necessary travel is at applicant's own expense.
- Applicant must hold a SECRET security Clearance.
- Direct combat probability code applies: No, male or female may apply
- Deployed Soldiers are encouraged to apply for jobs. Deployment will not be held against the Soldier during the hiring process.

BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION:

- a. Responsible for directing the survey team's entry and exit of a WMD incident site (Hot Zone).
- b. Position often requires donning Level A PPE in 100+ degree weather for approximately one hour at a time. A CST Survey Team Chief is responsible for leading entries into potential WMD sites, and he/she is often the most senior member of the team to directly interact with a suspected WMD. Therefore, the Survey Team Chief must be experienced, physically fit, mentally resilient, and willing to accept risk to ensure public safety. Additionally, he/she must be able to clearly communicate findings up the chain of command and to civil authorities. This includes verbal and written communication.
- c. Directs the collection of CBRN samples, initiates WMD-CST chain of custody procedures and maintains the team's capability to properly set up and operate state-of-the-art CBRN equipment and TIC detection, identification, survey and sample collection equipment.
- d. Knows CBRN antidote administration and safe patient extraction, crime scene/evidence preservation techniques, and uses the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Guide to ensure the appropriate respiratory protection has been selected for survey teams missions.
- e. Conducts a team (mission) brief before entering an incident site including the review of all known information on the hazard, wind direction and speed, safety

precautions, and types of tests to be conducted.

f. Oversees preventative maintenance and services for assigned equipment. Conducts pre-deployment checks to ensure team readiness. Responsible for the training and readiness of assigned team members. Continually develops and practices new TTPs to improve team efficiency. Conducts rehearsals and drills in the footprint prior to downrange entries. Ensures all equipment is operational and calibrated prior to entry into the hot zone. Assists in entry and sample planning. Reports points of interest or key hazards down range to the Survey Section Leader and Operations Center. Executes refit and recovery plan. Supervises repairs and replacements of equipment and expendables. Advises CBRN NCOIC and Survey Section Leader of lessons learned and possible changes to SOPs and TTPs.

g. Performs all operational tasks while wearing each level of Personnel Protective Equipment (PPE).

h. Identifies TIC warning placards and NATO contamination markers – report when/where/how they are used.

i. Crosses and mark contaminated areas.

j. Processes through decontamination sites.

k. Obtains chemical-biological samples for medical/scientific analysis.

l. Rescue and delivery of any injured persons to the decontamination station.

m. Observes and reports information on the physical layout of the incident site.

n. Attends designated agency domestic terrorism threat briefings.

o. Performs the duties of the CBRN NCOIC in their absence.
